God's Redemptive Story

Creation — God Creates

God creates everything good and creates mankind in His image.

From the beginning, His desire is relationship.

The Fall — Sin Enters

Adam and Eve choose independence over obedience.

Sin brings separation, suffering, and death — yet God immediately gives hope of a coming Deliverer.

Promise — God Unfolds His Plan

Through Abraham, Israel, Moses, the Passover, the Law, the Tabernacle, David, the Temple, and the prophets, God steadily reveals His character and His plan of redemption.

Jesus Christ — The Promise Fulfilled

The Creator enters His creation.

Jesus reveals the Father, fulfills the promises and prophecies, and becomes the perfect sacrifice for sin.

The Cross and Resurrection — Love's Greatest Victory

Jesus willingly bears the judgment for sin.

He rises from the dead, defeating sin and death.

Salvation is received by faith in Him.

The Church and New Creation — The Story Continues

The Holy Spirit empowers believers to carry the Gospel into the world.

Scripture ends with the promise of Christ's return, the defeat of evil, a new heaven and new earth, and God dwelling forever with His people.

Jesus Christ Is the Center

Every major movement in God's redemptive story prepares us to understand Jesus more clearly.

Jesus is:

- The eternal Word through whom all things were made.
- The promised Deliverer announced after the Fall.
- The true Passover Lamb.
- The greater Moses and perfect High Priest.
- The true Temple — God dwelling among humanity.
- The promised Son of David and eternal King.
- The suffering Servant and promised Messiah.
- The Savior who died and rose again.

As You Read God’s Word:

- Read slowly and prayerfully.
- Ask where the passage fits in God’s larger story.
- Look for what God is revealing about His character.
- Look for the connection to Jesus Christ.
- Apply what God is showing you to your daily walk.
